Additionally, we encountered beautifully flowered towers and Plane Ring planters in Münchberg. **Spread across various points of the town, these large planters brought life to the streets, adding color and a welcoming atmosphere.**

An interesting feature of the Plane Ring planters is that they can serve not only in a traditional role but also as small urban meadows. Due to their low height and wide rim, they are ideal for planting wild plants, creating natural resting areas for passersby. Furthermore, their wide rim serves as an additional seating space, functioning as a bench.



This practical solution allows both residents and tourists to take a break surrounded by greenery.
