Flower mishmash

Decorating the Flower Tower? No problem! Just select a few plants, preferably in different, contrasting colors, and plant them in loosely spaced groups. Is it really that simple? Not completely. The trick is to create such a composition that the aesthetic mishmash does not become a mess.

You will achieve a good effect if you use various colors of one plant to decorate the Flower Tower. Such a combination will always look nice, regardless of the plant's arrangement. It is good to put individual plant varieties in groups. In this way, it will be possible to obtain a unique and aesthetic composition.

simple base and add some vivid elements to it. For example, [the Flower Tower](#) decorated with layers of colorful petunia can be interlaced with lime ipomea. This combination is a recipe for an eye-catching composition.

An alternative to the plants arranged in standard layers is a composition with diagonal layers. The variant requires a bit more practice when planting, but the final effect is worth the effort.
